#### The Worship Service at Lake OPC

***We enter into God's presence*** humbly and sincerely at His invitation and command. Worship is a meeting of the Triune God with His covenant people through the finished work of Jesus Christ. The revelation of Almighty God elicits our praise in song and prayer.

***Seeking and responding to God's grace*** is our response to being in the very presence of the holy and living God. We confess our sins in praise or prayer and are comforted by God's declaration of pardon from Scripture. Out of gratitude for His forgiveness we give reverent attention to the reading of God's Word, and lift up our hearts to God in prayer and praise through our only Mediator, the Lord Jesus Christ.

***We hear God's Word*** as He speaks to us in His inspired written Word and by the voice of His called servant who proclaims to us the good news in Jesus Christ. God's Word encourages our faith as He teaches, reproves, corrects, and instructs us through it, that we might live lives of joy and new obedience to His glory.

***We receive God's Grace in Christ*** anew when we celebrate the Lord's Supper. In the holy supper we feed upon the Body and Blood of Christ which was given for us. We do so spiritually, through the Holy Spirit and by our faith in Christ, not corporally or carnally.
